



RATIONALE

The 1987 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines clearly states that "The State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels". Upon the passage of Republic Act 9155, or the Governance of Basic Education Act, Sec.2 states that "The State shall encourage local initiatives for improving the quality of basic education". With that, the Department of Education has taken initiatives to improve the quality of education. Continuous improvement is being done, through the results of research studies that plays a vital role in the formulation and adoption of policies that govern the implementation of the programs, projects and activities of the Department of Education.

In lieu of these, Dep Ed Order 39, s.2016, otherwise known as the Basic Education Research Agenda was issued and promulgated. The Department gives importance on the results of research in improving the education system. Anent to this, the Department of Education-Regional Office I have updated and added additional topics in the research agenda which would definitely serve as the basis in ensuring the right direction of research undertakings in the department. This would also ensure that the researches will focus on the following themes: (a) improving quality; (b) improving access to education; and, (c) improving governance.

The additional items on the Regional Research Agenda also highlights the different topics that would contribute to the attainment of the Happy Schools Movement of the region, which aims to produce happy and better learners. The agenda's span is for three years. The review, evaluation and monitoring processes as the key principles in enhancing the agenda will consider possible re-evaluation and updating at the end of each year, or as the need arises. Doing this will make the agenda more relevant to the demands of the time and the pertinent needs of the Department of Education, in general, and of Region I, in particular.










