


Dear Dr. Tacuycuy:

The University of Santo Tomas, Philippines in partnership with the UNESCO Chair in Adult Literacy and Learning for Social Transformation based in the University of East Anglia, United Kingdom is holding the first International Conference on Gender, Adult Literacy, and Active Citizenship for Social Transformation (GALACST) with the theme, "Literacles, gender equality, and active citizenship as pathways to empowerment and social transformation".

This international conference aims to engage participants in exploring how literacies, gender equality, and global citizenship can play key roles in the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. Adult literacy and learning has been seen as cross-cutting different sectors signalled by the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda. The international conference will be held on November 20-22, 2019 at the Thomas Aquinas Research Complex (TARC), University of Santo Tomas, Manila. The registration fee is \$5,500 for local participants and \$250 for international participants. Early birds can pay for just \$5000 and \$200 respectively. Please take note that we extended the deadline for early bird registration until September 30. The program consists of keynote lectures, plenary lectures, paper presentations, poster presentations and campfires (panel discussions).

We also invited Dr. Ulrike Hanneman as our special guest speaker for the launching of Transformare: A Network of Gender and Adult Literacy Advocates which will take place during our international conference.
